

Summary of Key Financial Indicators

- * Average Daily Membership (ADM) Overview -
 - Original Budget: 266 ADM
 - o Revised Budget: 286
 - o Actual: 281
- * The School's current revised budget projects a net surplus for the year of \$122,730. A projected cumulative fund balance of \$1,705,569 or 35% of expenditures at fiscal year-end.
- * Projected Days Cash on Hand for the projected fiscal year-end is 111 days. Above 30 days meets best practices.

Financial Statement Key Points


- * As of month-end, 91.7% of the year was complete.
- * Cash Balance as of the reporting period is \$1,390,239, down from \$1,463,186 the previous month.
- * State aids receivable shows a negative (\$21,609). This amount will be adjusted as MDE finalizes their year end reviews. MDE most likely paying more than expected based on last year's amounts.
- * Current year holdback estimated balance is \$425,145 as of the reporting period. The holdback amount is approximately 10% of total state aids. The remaining holdback amount will be paid back to the school in fiscal year 2024.
- * Revenues received at end of the reporting period 88.1%
- * Expenditures disbursed at end of the reporting period –86.2%


Other Items


- * The Cash on the Balance Sheet is broken out between the checking and the investment account for more clarity.
- * Interest Revenue is broken out on the Statement of Revenues and Expenditures. This line shows the interest earned from the new Investment account opened in October.
- * Food Service revenue shows reimbursements through the month of April.
- * Overall, the school is on track when comparing budget to actual bottom line.
- * Audit is scheduled for October 16-17 with ABDO.






